Chamberlain Hrdlicka Improves Practice and Individual Rankings in Chambers & Partners 2023 USA Guide

Chamberlain Hrdlicka ranked in the top ten U.S. tax law firms by Chambers & Partners

For the 17th consecutive year Chambers & Partners ranked Chamberlain Hrdlicka among the top ten tax law firms in the United States on both state and national levels. The firm made Band 1 in Tax Fraud nationwide, as one of only six law firms. The firm was ranked in Band 4 for Texas Tax placing Chamberlain Hrdlicka among one of the top tax firms in Texas. Individual Chamberlain Hrdlicka attorneys also achieved state and national rankings in the areas of high net worth, immigration, tax, tax controversy, tax litigation, and tax fraud.
