"Texas Court Overturns Local Sales Tax Sourcing Rule in Major Victory for Texas Cities," Citybiz

Citybiz reported on a significant ruling from the 250th District Court in Travis County, featuring insight from Bryan Dotson, senior counsel in Chamberlain Hrdlicka's Tax Controversy practice in San Antonio, regarding the invalidation of portions of Texas Comptroller Rule 3.334.

"The ruling is a victory for all Texans," Dotson stated. "At its core, Judge Crump's decision reinforces the fundamental principle that the Legislature sets the tax policy for the State of Texas. The decision also safeguards the public's right to participate in the rulemaking process by holding the Comptroller accountable for the procedural shortcomings in adopting the amendments to Rule 3.334."

Dotson, along with lead counsel Cindy Olson Bourland, represented the City of Round Rock in the consolidated lawsuit challenging the Comptroller's amendments that would have created a de facto destination-based tax sourcing framework.
