She has the honor of being the only attorney who has been selected by two Fortune 500 fast food corporations to defend claims and litigation involving a variety of issues in Michigan, including tort liability and alleged civil rights violations.

Dora is also active in her community. She previously served on the Board of Directors for Ronald McDonald House Charities in Detroit and on the Board of Directors of LIFT Women's Resource Center (Detroit), an organization established to assist women struggling with various social issues, including domestic violence and substance abuse.
