Arbitration. Instead of going straight to court, the parties may decide to proceed to arbitration, in which the parties choose a neutral attorney as an arbitrator to oversee their case. Many individuals select arbitration because: (1) it allows them to have more control over the process, (2) the information exchanged in arbitration is not part of a public record, and (3) the expense may be less than that of traditional divorce. Collaborative-Style Divorce. In a collaborative-style divorce, spouses who are able to maintain a civil, honest, and constructive discourse, work directly with one another in a structured and safe environment. Both parties may retain attorneys, as well as other advisors such as financial or therapeutic experts, to assist in the process of resolving the financial, custody, and support issues that arise in divorce. Once finalized, the parties' settlement is submitted to the court for approval.
