P riyanka Timblo is a trial lawyer who represents clients in high-stakes commercial litigation and arbitration on both sides of the "v". She has secured eight-and nine-figure judgments on behalf of her clients, in bench and jury trials. Bloomberg Law has recognized her as one of the top 40 lawyers under 40 nationwide, and Benchmark Litigation has called her a Future Star.

Priyanka has particular experience in antitrust and breach of contract disputes. She has also handled securities class actions, internal investigations, and white-collar matters. She is skilled at crafting case narratives, developing trial strategy from the outset of a case, and preparing and examining witnesses.
