PARTNERS MIKE SHUSTER, DAN GOLDBERG, AND BLAIR KAMINSKY ALSO RECOGNIZED INDIVIDUALLY IN 2024 GUIDE

New York—Holwell Shuster & Goldberg LLP has been recognized as a leading firm for Litigation: General Commercial in New York (Band 2) in the Chambers USA 2024 guide. Additionally, founding partners Mike Shuster and Dan Goldberg, along with partner and HSG management committee member Blair Kaminsky, again received individual recognition in this year's guide.

Clients and industry peers note, “The lawyers are all exceptional, very skilled top to bottom. All three partners were recognized for general commercial litigation in New York.

The recognition from Chambers comes on the heels of two massive trial wins the firm secured in the past two months alone. In the first, HSG secured a \$101 million jury verdict against Walmart in a lawsuit alleging the company wrongfully cancelled its contract to purchase personal protective equipment during the pandemic; in the second, the firm secured a jury verdict finding Boeing liable for \$81.3 million for misappropriating substantial trade secrets related to the development of electric and hybrid-electric aircrafts.
