

Miller Canfield Attorney Will Speak at a University of Michigan Seminar

Andrzej Chelchowski, a principal at the law firm of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C., and director of its Warsaw office, will take part in a colloquium on "*Invisible Effects and Unintended Consequences of European Union Enlargement*" at the University of Michigan's Center for Russian and East European Studies (CREES), Monday, February 10, from 12:00 - 3:00 p.m.

Other panelists include: Joseph H. H. The discussant is József Böröcz, associate professor of sociology and Director of Hungarian Studies, Rutgers University; and the moderator is Daniel Halberstam, assistant professor of law, U-M School of Law. Chelchowski is a licensed Polish legal advisor (radca prawny). He graduated from the Department of Law and Administration of the Warsaw University, and is completing his doctorate degree in law, specializing in agricultural law. He specializes in business law, especially joint ventures, real estate development and property law. He has participated in numerous projects connected with the harmonization of Polish law with the law of the European Union.
