Where they fail to comply with the regulations, they face potential civil and criminal penalties.

Richardson’s presentation will focus on the impact of export controls on Software-as-a-Service (SaaS) providers. He is an international/export controls lawyer that assists clients in the information technology and defense sectors on matters including mergers and acquisitions, distribution agreements, joint ventures, and strategic corporate structuring.
