

Miller Canfield Attorney Graduates from Leadership Oakland's Cornerstone Program

Freeman L. Farrow, M.D., an associate at the law firm of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C., graduated on June 8 from Leadership Oakland's Cornerstone Program, a nine-month networking and training program that develops participants' leadership skills, explores key issues impacting the region, and enables participants to reach their full potential professionally, personally, and in the community.

He is a board member of the Child Abuse and Neglect Council of Oakland County, and a board member of The International School, Farmington Hills, Michigan. He is a member of the American Academy of Family Practice, and is a life alumnus of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Southeastern Michigan.

Farrow received his law degree from the University of Michigan Law School in 1997; he is a 1990 Diplomate of the St. Clare's Hospital Family Practice Residency Program in Schenectady, New York; and earned his M.D. in 1987 from the University of Massachusetts Medical School; and a B.A. in Chemistry from Amherst College in 1983.

He resides in Ann Arbor, Michigan, with his wife, Moira, a PhD candidate in Urban and Regional Planning at the University of Michigan.
