

Miller Canfield Attorney Lectured in Germany

Frederick A. Acomb, a principal in the Detroit office of the law firm of **Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C.**, spoke at two seminars in Germany on April 10-11, 2000. The seminars were held in the town of Bretten and are titled *Medium-sized Companies as Global Players* sponsored by the Pforzheim Chamber of Commerce and Schindhelm & Pfisterer, a German law firm headquartered in Pforzheim. The seminars were directed toward German companies desiring to expand their businesses into the European Union and the United States. Speakers were chosen from law firms with an international practice. The seminars covered German law (Schindhelm & Pfisterer), British law (Gregory, Rowcliff & Milners), French law (Deutsch-Französische Anwaltskanzlei Epp), and U.S. law (Miller Canfield).

Acomb spoke on choice of law clauses, choice of forum clauses, sales representative agreements, distribution agreements, and sale of goods contracts.
