

## Miller Canfield Participates in 2006 Goodfellow Doll Program

For about two decades the law firm of Miller Canfield has made dressing dolls for the Old Newsboys' Goodfellow Fund of Detroit a holiday tradition. This year, attorneys and staff dressed over 200 dolls to be distributed by the Detroit Police Department to girls ages 5 to 11 in Detroit, Hamtramck, and Highland Park.

For some, participating in the Goodfellows' spirit extends beyond the firm's participation.
