

Miller Canfield Research Analyst Participates in LexisNexis Teleconference on Expert Research

Michael Brennan, a research analyst in the Detroit office of the law firm of Miller Canfield, will participate in a teleconference panel discussion hosted by LexisNexis on September 25, 2007 entitled, "Finding the Skeleton in the Closet - How to Conduct Superior Expert Research."
