EXPERIENCE

- ▶ Bob Hope Airport Terminal Security Enhancement Project. The Bob Hope Airport Terminal Security Enhancement Project renovated and expanded Terminal A of the passenger terminal building to achieve security screening enhancements and additional fire/emergency access. Kevin advised the Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority on entitlements for the project.
