The shift, in particular, is in regard to Small Modular Reactors (SMRs) – compact, factory-built reactors that offer a safer, cleaner, and more flexible energy alternative to traditional nuclear plants. SMRs may benefit from distinct advantages, from a legal standpoint, and are poised to become a core part of America's energy infrastructure.

Aleksey explains how a combination of legal challenges against the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and definitive executive orders concerning nuclear power signals the start of a new regulatory era where the focus shifts from whether SMRs are feasible to how quickly and under what rules they will be deployed. The article frames this moment as a turning point for nuclear modernization in the U.S.
