

# Alexander Tachmes Warns Ocean Drive Closure 'Wreaking Havoc' on Local Businesses

CBS 4 News reports that Miami Beach's Ocean Drive has been completely closed to vehicles since last year, originally as a way for many of the businesses to spread out and mitigate the effects of COVID-19.

However, Alexander Tachmes, a partner in the Miami office of Shutts & Bowen LLP, says his client – the iconic Clevelander – wants the pedestrian-only setup discontinued. He states that the closure creates operational problems for businesses that face Ocean and attracts trouble.

"We've been complaining to the City to at least open one lane for us since December and they have rejected our request to have that," he said. "The closure of the street is facilitating people walking down the street in groups and wreaking havoc."
