Miami Beach wants to turn down the volume in Miami Beach. However, these efforts have raised complaints about racism, classism and business practices, according to an article by the Associated Press.

Miami Beach Mayor Dan Gelber's long-term proposal includes rebranding the blocks known as the entertainment district by hosting higher-end concerts and fairs, focusing on family-friendly events and marketing the impressive museums and symphonies. He also wants to limit music and halt alcohol sales at 2 a.m. However, Shutts Miami partner [Alexander Tachmes](#) has pointed out that many local businesses have decried the idea of siphoning off established businesses in an attempt by the City to rebrand and court more "cultural" businesses.

"If you can't afford \$200 for two people for dinner, you [still] have the right to eat and have a nice drink and watch a football game. You don't have to have a Michelin restaurant in order to eliminate crime," he said.
