

Amid Ongoing Condo Collapse Tragedy, Law360 Details Lawsuit Filed by Resident

Following the collapse of the 12-story building in Surfside, Florida, a resident filed a lawsuit against the building's condominium association, claiming it failed to ensure the safety of its residents. Law360 spoke with engineers and attorneys, including Shutts & Bowen's Construction Practice Group leader, Timothy D. Woodward, about the timeline and scale of the disaster's investigation.

According to *Law360*, resident Manuel Drezner sued Champlain Towers South Condominium Association Inc. for not preventing the collapse of the northeast section of the building. As rescue crews continue to search for the building's unaccounted residents, *Law360* spoke to attorneys and engineers about the ongoing investigation into what went wrong. Contributing to those insights, Tim explained that while a root cause for the catastrophe may be identified early on, the full scope of the factors responsible for the tragedy will also be later analyzed in the investigation. According to the article, the investigation could take months, if not a full year.
