Fort Lauderdale partner Edward O'Sheehan is a former U.S. Marine who currently serves as a judge advocate general and staff judge advocate for the Florida Army National Guard. As an army lawyer in South Florida, Ed is used to being called into duty when hurricanes hit. But as the COVID-19 pandemic loomed, Ed braced for a different kind of impact.

In a profile published by The *Daily Business Review*, Ed discusses his contributions in helping transform the Miami Beach Convention Center into a 450-bed COVID-19 field hospital and establishing testing sites at C.B. Smith Park, Hard Rock Stadium, Marlins Park and Amelia Earhart Park.

"If a hurricane hits, we know what to do. We're used to doing that. This is a totally new mission. We've never done anything like a pandemic," Ed said.

Ed described the obstacles faced, like ensuring the safety of the soldiers, nursing home residents and general public while conducting tests.
