

Jake Monk Speaks on AI in the Insurance Industry at the International Claim Association's 2023 Annual Education Conference

On October 3, Miami Insurance partner Jake Monk gave two presentations at the International Claim Association's Annual Education Conference in Marco Island, Florida.

Jake presented on artificial intelligence and early legislation and regulations on insurers related to their use of predictive modeling and algorithmic decision making in a presentation titled, "Rise of the Machines: An Overview of Artificial Intelligence and Early Regulations on the Insurance Industry." He focused on and demonstrated a variety of artificial intelligence tools, such as generative pre-trained transformers (GPTs), and examined recent legislation and proposed regulations on life insurance underwriting, civil rights acts, and fair housing legislation targeting predictive decision making and the potential impacts on life and disability insurers.

In a separate seminar, Jake also presented on the legal background and legal considerations related to e-signatures in the fields of life and disability insurance in a presentation titled, "E-Signatures: A Changing Paradigm of Identity," along with co-panelists Alejandra Muller (Special Investigator at American Fidelity Assurance Company) and Jake Obstfeld (Head of Client Development at Evadata, Inc.) who discussed fraud and technological considerations with electronic signatures.
