

My Summer Associate Experience: Keegan Stinnett

As a Summer Associate, I think the three keys to success are enthusiasm, humility, and diligence. Accept what you do not know and challenge yourself to go the extra mile to deliver the best work product you can.

Describe a typical day as a summer associate at Shutts.

I would typically get to the office between 8am-9am, get a coffee, check my email, and start working on my assignments. Partners and associates frequently stopped by my office to check in, invite me to lunch, or loop me into a matter they were working on. I would get assignments from a variety of practice groups by email, phone, or in-person and was asked to produce memos, pleadings, closing documents, exhibits, etc. It was typical for the firm to provide free food and I rarely had to plan for breakfast or lunch.

What were your expectations for the summer and have they been met (or exceeded)?
