

Nicholas Meros Speaks at Florida Chamber Foundation's 39th Annual Environmental Permitting Conference

Nicholas Meros, a partner in Shutts & Bowen LLP's Tallahassee office, recently spoke on a panel during the Florida Chamber Foundation's 39th Annual Environmental Permitting Summer School Conference, held July 15-18 at the JW Marriott Marco Island Beach Resort.

Nick spoke as a member of the "Emerging Issues in Pollution Liability and Technological Innovations" panel. This panel focused on the evolution of environmental enforcement in Florida. Nick discussed recent significant cases and future trends in pollution liability under section 376.313, Florida Statutes. Course panelists also discussed the policy in the context of the regulation of solid and hazardous waste, soils and water quality, explained the legal and technical developments affecting pollution liability, and featured impacts to both property owners and facility operators.
