

Scott Glass Presents to APA Florida Orlando Metro Section

On Friday, February 10, 2023, Orlando partner Scott Glass presented a 90-minute primer on Land Use Law as part of an all-day training session for county and municipal planning commissioners, elected officials, local government managers and professional planning staff. The program was sponsored by the Orlando Metro Section of the Florida Chapter of the American Planning Association.

Scott, who has been Board Certified by The Florida Bar in City, County and Local Government Law for over a decade, primarily addressed restrictions placed on the scope and nature of land use and planning by the United States and Florida Constitutions, as well as by Federal, State and local statutes and ordinances. In addition to covering such diverse topics as physical takings, regulatory takings and the regulation of signs and adult uses, Scott provided a tutorial on best practices for conducting both legislative and quasi-judicial hearings, including briefing the attendees on Florida's Government in the Sunshine and Public Records Acts.
