

Shutts & Bowen Assists with Multi-Million Dollar Palm Beach Gardens Office Purchase

MHCommercial Real Estate Fund and New York-based Waterfall Asset Management purchased Golden Bear Plaza, a Palm Beach Gardens office complex originally developed by Jack Nicklaus, for \$49.75 million.

The 243,000-square-foot office complex, located at 11750, 11760, and 11770 U.S. Highway 1, sold for \$205 per square foot. Tenants include AT&T, Pike Electric, NextEra Energy and SlimFast.

This purchase is MHC's third acquisition. This fund was formed in 2019 by NAI/Merin Hunter Codman principals with the assistance of Shutts' lawyers Mark Stevenson and Olga Pina. NAI/Merin Hunter Codman will manage and lease the property. This is the first acquisition of a South Florida office property by Waterfall.

West Palm Beach Managing Partner Art Menor represented the buyers in the deal. Elizabeth Jones, Eric Neumann and Sally Godfrey assisted with the purchase. John Strickroot handled the mortgage loan closing. Mark Stevenson handled the negotiation of the Joint Venture Agreement between MHCommercial and Waterfall.
