

Aliette DelPozo Rodz Addresses Protection of Companies' Trademarks in Cuba

In an article published in the May 2017 issue of *Cuba Trade Magazine*, partner [Aliette DelPozo Rodz](#) explains the challenges regarding Cuba's "first-to-file" trademark system and the differences from the United States' "use-based" trademark system.
